RESOLUTION RATIFYING EMERGENCY CONTRACTS FOR THE REPLACEMENT OF WATER BOILERS AND

REESTABLISHMENT OF HEAT SERVICES

PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 40A:11-6

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority of the Borough of Glassboro (GHA) awarded an emergency contract to WOLFSCHMIDT PLUMBING, HEATING & COOLING, pursuant to the Local Public Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-6; and

WHEREAS, on January 24, 2025, during maintenance service a crack heat exchanger was discovered on Building #5's Boiler, presenting an immediate hazard to the health and well-being of the residents of Whitney Gardens Apartments #24, #24A, #26 and #26A Williams Street; and

WHEREAS, the Affordable Housing Operations Director deemed this an emergency repair; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Director was notified and was satisfied that an emergency did exist, and authorized the award of said contract to WOLFSCHMIDT PLUMBING, HEATING & COOLING, for the replacement of Building #5's Boiler and reestablishment of heat service in the amount of \$11,275.00, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:11-6(a) for such purposes as may be necessary to respond to the emergency; and

WHEREAS, during repairs, WOLFSCHMIDT PLUMBING, HEATING & COOLING, discovered similar conditions on Building #4's Boiler, presenting an immediate hazard to the health and well-being of the residents of Summit Park Apartments #118, #119, #120, #121, and #122 Grillo Street, resulting on the replacement of Building #4's Boiler and establishment of heat service in the amount of \$11,275.00; and

WHEREAS, the Finance Director identified that R&R funds were available to cover the cost necessary to respond to the emergency; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of the Housing Authority of the Borough of Glassboro, that the emergency contracts with <u>WOLFSCHMIDT PLUMBING</u>, <u>HEATING & COOLING</u> in the combined amount of \$22,550.00, for the replacement of two (2) Boilers and reestablishment of heat service to the buildings, as authorized by the Executive Director, is hereby acknowledged and ratified.
