RESOLUTION RATIFYING EMERGENCY CONTRACT AND APPROVING EXPENSE REIMBURSEMENT FOR THE ACCOMMODATIONS OF DISPLACED RESIDENTS PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 40A:11-6

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority of the Borough of Glassboro (GHA) awarded an emergency contract to **RESIDENCE INN DEPTFORD**, pursuant to the Local Public Contracts Law, *N.J.S.A.* 40A:11-6; and

WHEREAS, on February 16, 2025, during a high winds weather event, all units at Delsea Manor apartments lost electricity and therefore heat; and

WHEREAS, a Code Blue was called by the Gloucester County Office of Emergency Management (OEM) that mandated the evacuation of residents to alternate locations, due to falling temperatures; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Director deemed this an emergency affecting the public health, safety, or welfare, and authorized the award of said contract to **RESIDENCE INN DEPTFORD**, for the lodging of (26) twenty-six residents in the amount of \$5,762.00, in accordance with *N.J.S.A.* 40A:11-6(a) for such purposes as may be necessary to respond to the emergency; and

WHEREAS, a credit card was required to complete the transaction with **RESIDENCE INN DEPTFORD**, and GHA, as a Public Housing entity, is not legally permitted to open such an account; and

WHEREAS, to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the displaced residents, the Executive Director utilized her personal credit card to complete the transaction with <u>RESIDENCE INN DEPTFORD</u> and secure sufficient rooms to accommodate all displaced residents; and

WHEREAS, the Finance Director identified that Operating Account funds were available to cover the cost necessary to respond to the emergency; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of the Housing Authority of the Borough of Glassboro, that the emergency contract with **RESIDENCE INN DEPTFORD** in the amount of **\$5,762.00**, for the lodging of (26) twenty-six residents, as authorized by the Executive Director, is hereby acknowledged and ratified.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Executive Director be reimbursed for the full amount of \$5,762.00 spent to cover the cost necessary to respond to the emergency.
