# PUBLIC ACCESS TO OFFICE POLICY

**ADOPTED:** April 15, 2025

# Housing Authority of the Borough of Glassboro Public Access to Office Policy

The Housing Authority of the Borough of Glassboro (GHA) hereby establishes this Public Access to Office Policy ("Policy") to establish guidelines and procedures for maintaining a safe, professional, and accessible office environment for all visitors who enter the following GHA business offices:

- GHA Main Office 181 Delsea Manor Drive, Glassboro, NJ 08028
- GHA Williams Office 30 Williams Street, Glassboro, NJ 08028

### 1. Definitions

- A. "Visitors" shall be defined as program participants, applicants, tenants and their legal representatives, job candidates, and other visitors.
- B. "Personal Visitors" shall be defined as visiting family and friends of GHA and Housing Authority of Gloucester County (HAGC) personnel.
- C. "Authorized Personnel" shall be defined as GHA/HAGC employees normally reporting to other locations, Board members, professional services providers (legal counsel, consultants, auditors), contractors, and vendors.

### 2. Access

Open from 8:30am until 4:00pm. Closed for lunch from 12:00 p.m. until 1:00 p.m.

Areas will be designated at each building. Not all buildings may have the same number of areas.

- A. Vestibule: Open to the public requesting general information. No further access will be permitted without an appointment.
- B. Waiting Area: Open to tenants wishing to pay their rent in person, Visitors with an appointment, or Personal Visitors waiting for a GHA/HAGC employee escort. No further access will be permitted without an appointment. Individuals delivering goods or packages will remain in the waiting area until the appropriate GHA/HAGC employee expecting the delivery is notified and is able to receive the delivery.
- C. Bathroom: Open to Personal Visitors and Authorized Personnel. Not open to the public.

D. Meeting Area: Available by appointment only. Appointments are approved at the discretion of the GHA/HAGC employee requested to attend the meeting.

### 3. Security

For GHA to maintain secure offices, security measures may include but are not limited to:

- A. Visitor Sign-In: All Visitors and Personal Visitors will be required to sign in, show a form of ID and receive a visitor's badge, which will be worn at all times and returned once the visit is over. Authorized Personnel are not required to sign in or carry a visitor's badge.
- B. Visitor Escort: All Visitors and Personal Visitors will be escorted by a GHA/HAGC employee while on the premises. GHA/HAGC employees providing escorts shall notify their supervisor of any visitor escort prior to escort.
- C. Security Cameras: Security and other designated GHA/HAGC personnel may monitor the cameras to ensure proper supervision and security.
- D. Emergency Procedures: All GHA/HAGC employees providing escorts should be familiar with emergency procedures, including evacuation routes and emergency contact information.
- E. Internet Network Access: Visitors, Personal Visitors, and Authorized Personnel that require internet network access may be provided with credentials to access the guest wireless network at the discretion of the IT Director, or designee.

### 4. Prohibited Activities

The following activities are prohibited in GHA offices:

- A. Soliciting or distributing materials without the prior authorization of GHA/HAGC.
- B. Engaging in disruptive or offensive behavior.
- C. Smoking, vaping, or engaging in drug related activities.
- D. Political Activities.

### 5. Accessibility

GHA will provide reasonable accommodation(s) to Visitors, Personal Visitors, and Authorized Personnel with disabilities if requested and approved by the GHA Reasonable Accommodation Coordinator in advance of the visit to ensure that all Visitors, Personal Visitors, and Authorized Personnel can access and utilize the GHA offices equally.

### 6. Personal Visitors

GHA/HAGC employees may have occasional visits from family and friends with the advanced approval of the employee's supervisor. Personal Visitors must be escorted by the employee while in the office. Visits should remain short whenever possible. GHA/HAGC employees will be held responsible for the actions of the employee's Personal Visitors.

### 7. Pets

Pets are not permitted, unless approved in advance by management; however, assistance animals as defined in the GHA Assistance Animal Policy are permitted.

### 8. Compliance

All Visitors, Personal Visitors, and Authorized Personnel who enter GHA offices, and GHA/HAGC employees permitting access, are expected to comply with this Policy and all other applicable GHA policies and procedures.

### 9. Enforcement

All Visitors, Personal Visitors, and Authorized Personnel violating this Policy may be temporarily or permanently banned from GHA offices at the discretion of the GHA Executive Director. Banned individuals accessing, or attempting to access, GHA offices may be subject to criminal prosecution. If applicable, GHA/HAGC employees violating this Policy may be subject to disciplinary action.

#### 10. Review

This Policy will be reviewed periodically to ensure its effectiveness and relevance.
